DIXON COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS PROCEEDINGS

The Dixon County Board of Supervisors met on June 14, 2022 at 9:00 A.M. for an adjourned meeting in the Jury Room in the Dixon County Courthouse in Ponca, Nebraska. Chair Lisa Lunz opened the meeting with the Pledge of Allegiance and called for roll call of members present. Answering was: Don Andersen, Neil Blohm, Terry Nicholson, Steve Hassler, Roger Peterson, Deric Anderson, and Lisa Lunz. Also present were Cindy Purucker, Dixon County Clerk and Secretary to the Board of Supervisors and other interested persons. Chair Lunz gave notice to the public of the location of the posted Open Meetings Law.

Motion was made by Andersen, seconded by Peterson to show that this meeting was preceded by due and legal notice by posting as required by law in the Bank of Dixon County, bulletin board in the lower hall of the courthouse, bulletin board in the County Clerk's office and two County newspapers, and all Board Members were notified simultaneously and the agenda of all know business to come before the Board of Supervisors was posted in the office of the County Clerk. On roll call vote, Motion carried. Supervisors voting in favor of said motion were: Don Andersen, Neil Blohm, Steve Hassler, Terry Nicholson, Roger Peterson, Deric Anderson, and Lisa Lunz. Absent: None. Supervisors voting against: None.

Motion was made by Nicholson, seconded by Hassler to approve the minutes of the last meeting as written. On roll call vote, Motion carried. Supervisors voting in favor of said motion were: Don Andersen, Neil Blohm, Steve Hassler, Terry Nicholson, Roger Peterson, Deric Anderson, and Lisa Lunz. Absent: None. Supervisors voting against: None.

Dixon County Road Supt., Arnold Mellick and Engineer, Brian McDonald were present to discuss ongoing road and bridge projects.

Engineer McDonald thought money from the Soybean Board grant could be used for precast girders on project C-26(288) the Krusemark bridge. It could be let this fall. His is working on paperwork to rehab bridge 405 north of Maskell on 888 Road. It could be let as soon as September. The Dixon NE culvert project has been completed.

Highway Supt. Arnold Mellick is working on procuring right-of-way on the Martinsburg E and Emerson North projects.

Chair Lunz handed out a bridge map & spreadsheet on bridge traffic & load ratings. She asked the Board to look them over and make recommendations for budget purposes and the new 1&6 Year Road Plan for October.

The Wakefield West project came in under the bid contract price. Motion was made by Peterson to approve and sign Change Order #1 on the Wakefield West project, seconded by Hassler. On roll call vote: Motion carried. Supervisors voting in favor of said motion were: Don Andersen, Neil Blohm, Steve Hassler, Terry Nicholson, Roger Peterson, Deric Anderson, and Lisa Lunz. Absent: None. Supervisors voting against: None.

Motion was made by Peterson, seconded by Blohm to approve the Final Pay Application on the Wakefield West project. On roll call vote: Motion carried. Supervisors voting in favor of said motion were: Don Andersen, Neil Blohm, Steve Hassler, Terry Nicholson, Roger Peterson, Deric Anderson, and Lisa Lunz. Absent: None. Supervisors voting against: None.

Motion was made by Nicholson to sign the Notice of Award, Notice to Proceed and Agreement with Krusemark Construction & Excavation, LLC for the Martinsburg East project, seconded by Blohm. On roll call vote: Motion carried. Supervisors voting in favor of said motion were: Don Andersen, Neil Blohm, Steve Hassler, Terry Nicholson, Roger Peterson, Deric Anderson, and Lisa Lunz. Absent: None. Supervisors voting against: None.

Motion was made by Nicholson to sign the Notice of Award, Notice to Proceed and Agreement with Husker Engineering, Inc. for the Emerson North culvert project, seconded by Blohm. On roll call vote: Motion carried. Supervisors voting in favor of said motion were: Don Andersen, Neil Blohm, Steve Hassler, Terry Nicholson, Roger Peterson, Deric Anderson, and Lisa Lunz. Absent: None. Supervisors voting against: None.

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Right of Way agreements with Dietrich Schweers and Wyatt Mellick for the Martinsburg East project were received. We are still waiting for one more agreement. Motion was made by Hassler to sign the agreements that were received, seconded by Peterson. On roll call vote: Motion carried. Supervisors voting in favor of said motion were: Don Andersen, Neil Blohm, Steve Hassler, Terry Nicholson, Roger Peterson, Deric Anderson, and Lisa Lunz. Absent: None. Supervisors voting against: None.

Project C-26(324) Maskell North (Loy Nelson bridge) was discussed. The Board would like to rehab the bridge. Motion to sign the resolution to add project C-26(324) to the 1&6 Year Road Plan was made by Peterson, seconded by Anderson. On roll call vote: Motion carried. Supervisors voting in favor of said motion were: Don Andersen, Neil Blohm, Steve Hassler, Terry Nicholson, Roger Peterson, Deric Anderson, and Lisa Lunz. Absent: None. Supervisors voting against: None. **Resolution in Resolution & Ordinances Book 3 Page 209.**

Bryan Gotch, Village of Newcastle, was present to discuss the heavy truck traffic that is going over their village streets. He wanted to start a dialogue with the Board to make them aware that there may be weight restrictions on their streets. There may be roads that need to have work on them due to more traffic that will not be allowed to go through town. The Board discussed getting a commercial drive from Highway 12 that would service the state shed and county shed. Supervisors Anderson and Peterson will talk with the state maintenance foreman about a drive approach.

At 9:30 A.M. Public Hearing was opened to consider the closure of part of 888 Road in Hooker Township. Testimony was given by Loy Nelson and Tiffany Stegemann. Mr. Nelson stated that he has no problem closing the road but would like to see it closed after the bridge is fixed. Ms. Stegemann stated that since no one travels the road and has not for many years they just want to straighten out the property line instead of having it follow the old road and terrain. The hearing closed at 9:45 A.M.

Motion was made by Anderson to sign the resolution to offer the road to Hooker Township for closing on the condition that it be closed only after the bridge is fixed, seconded by Blohm. On roll call vote: Motion carried. Supervisors voting in favor of said motion were: Don Andersen, Neil Blohm, Steve Hassler, Terry Nicholson, Roger Peterson, Deric Anderson, and Lisa Lunz. Absent: None. Supervisors voting against: None. **Resolution in Resolution & Ordinances Book 3 Page 210.**

Discussion was had on adding fund 700 – Special Road Fund to the Chart of Accounts. Motion to add fund 700 was made by Anderson, seconded by Peterson. On roll call: Motion carried. Supervisors voting in favor of said motion were: Don Andersen, Neil Blohm, Steve Hassler, Terry Nicholson, Roger Peterson, Deric Anderson, and Lisa Lunz. Absent: None. Supervisors voting against: None.

Chair Lunz received a letter from Charlie Henery, Region 11 Emergency Management. Mr. Henery wanted to thank and commend Shea Scollard for assisting in the Hazmat exercise conducted in May.

Emergency Manager, Shea Scollard, gave the Board an update on last month's activities. He finished the Newcastle siren proposal. Security plans are ready for the Officials Meeting on the 20th & ready to add to the Emergency Action Plan.

911 Director, Sara Kumm, gave an update on NextGen 911, and Statewide Radio networking. The new funding ratio for 911 has come in. Last week the Newcastle tower had wind damage. Cables were broken loose by the wind. She called the climber and he said that the bracket on the antenna was broken as well as three guidewires were damaged and need replaced. There will be a fire chiefs meeting on June 29th in Concord at 7 P.M. They are also getting ready for security at the fair.

Shea received the completed Hazardous Mitigation Plan. Motion was made by Anderson to sign the plan, seconded by Blohm. On roll call vote: Motion carried. Supervisors voting in favor of said motion were: Don Andersen, Neil Blohm, Steve Hassler, Terry Nicholson, Roger Peterson, Deric Anderson, and Lisa Lunz. Absent: None. Supervisors voting against: None.

The Board discussed the Missouri River Northeast Community Wildfire Protection Plan. Motion was made by Nicholson and seconded by Blohm to sign the plan with Cedar, Dakota, Knox Counties and The Nebraska Forest Service. On roll call vote: Motion carried. Supervisors voting in favor of said motion were:

Motion was made by Andersen to allow the Sheriff's office to dispose of non-functioning items on inventory. A listing is found in the County Clerk's Office. Seconded by Hassler. Outstanding loans on machinery was discussed. It was decided to pay off the maintainer loan with the money left in the road budget. Motion was made by Peterson, seconded by Blohm. On roll call vote: Motion carried. Supervisors voting in favor of said motion were: Don Andersen, Neil Blohm, Steve Hassler, Terry Nicholson, Roger Peterson, Deric Anderson, and Lisa Lunz. Absent: None. Supervisors voting against: None.

Jon Cannon, NACO, was present to discuss Inheritance Tax and the budget hearing notice changes. He also stated that National Association of County Officials will be in Denver this year. Discussion was had on cybersecurity and the 10 & 30 committee in NACO to look at what county government will look like in 10 years and 30 years.

The Board recessed to meet as Board of Equalization and reconvened with all members present.

Julie Rother, Northeast Nebraska District Health Dept., was present to explain the connection between the county and the health dept. She handed out information what the duties and responsibilities of the Health Dept. are. COVID was a struggle to keep up with. She is currently trying to find larger office and storage space for the Health Dept. The pandemic took a toll on their finances, and she requested that the Board keep them in mind when dispersing the ARPA funds. Dixon County makes up 18% of the population in the health district.

Because of LB 644 and the need to notify the public of any subdivisions that will increase their budget by 2% + growth the need for a printing company is recommended. MIPS can give the information directly to the state printshop instead of getting the information to another printer by hand. Motion to use the state printshop was made by Peterson, seconded by Andersen. On roll call vote: Motion carried. Supervisors voting in favor of said motion were: Don Andersen, Neil Blohm, Steve Hassler, Terry Nicholson, Roger Peterson, Deric Anderson, and Lisa Lunz. Absent: None. Supervisors voting against: None.

Correspondence was reviewed.

The Board took a break for lunch at 12:00 P.M. and reconvened at 1:00 P.M.

County Attorney Leland Miner met with the board to discuss county legal business.

Chair Lunz started a discussion on uniform fines for mowing roads for people that do not comply with the law. The discussion was tabled until the July 12th meeting.

Gary & Rose Fluent, MaryAnn Kollbaum were in attendance for the determination on the road petition requested by Carl Kneifl. Mr. Kneifl's attorney Ryan Cwach attended by conference call. County Attorney, Leland Miner, asked for comments from the attendees. There was none. He also read statute regarding isolated lands. Mr. Miner read a motion to deny the petition of Carl Kneifl for an access road to his property in Section 13, Township 31, Range 5 East of the 6th P.M. for the following reasons:

1. The property was isolated at the time he acquired ownership; therefore, the requirements of section 39-1716(1)(b) is not satisfied.
2. The evidence presented does not establish that the isolation of the land was not caused by Carl Kneifl or anyone else and therefore section 39-1716(1)(c) is not satisfied.
3. The petition is virtually the same as the prior petitions filed in 2008 & 2009.
4. That the petition is for similar relief in the District Court Case No. CI09-42 that denied the petition with prejudice and that reconsideration of the same issue, absent new evidence is not available and is barred by the doctrine of Res Judicata
5. No new evidence was presented
6. Evidence presented at the hearing on May 10, 2022 does not meet the requirements of Nebraska Revised Statutes section 39-1713 and 39-1716.

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Motion was made to deny the petition of Carl Kneifl by Nicholson, seconded by Blohm. On roll call vote: Motion carried. Supervisors voting in favor of said motion were: Don Andersen, Neil Blohm, Terry Nicholson, Deric Anderson, and Lisa Lunz. Abstaining: Hassler & Peterson. Absent: None. Motion carried; petition denied.

The Board discussed the Interlocal Agreement with the City of Ponca for police dispatch services with the County of Dixon. Motion was made by Andersen to sign the agreement, seconded by Anderson. On roll call vote: Motion carried. Supervisors voting in favor of said motion were: Don Andersen, Neil Blohm, Steve Hassler, Terry Nicholson, Roger Peterson, Deric Anderson, and Lisa Lunz. Absent: None. Supervisors voting against: None.

The Allen Road shop is looking to hire a new person. According to our union attorney we can hire at a higher step in the union contract if they have some experience. We can also give their annual raise after July 1st.

We are waiting on road drag prices from a couple of companies. Discussion was had on also purchasing a gravel retriever.

Amy Kleinberg, Three Rivers Benefits, was present to go over the health insurance rates for the next year. Motion was made to move our health insurance to PACE underwriters. The plan will stay the same except it will be less expensive. Motion was made by Blohm to move to PACE underwriters, seconded by Anderson. On roll call vote Motion carried. Supervisors voting in favor of said motion were: Don Andersen, Neil Blohm, Steve Hassler, Terry Nicholson, Roger Peterson, Deric Anderson, and Lisa Lunz. Absent: None. Supervisors voting against: None.

No offices are going over their budgets.

The Board reviewed the Sheriff's Distress Warrant List and the Treasurer's Distress Warrant Report.

The County Official's Fee Reports and Treasurer's List of Pledged Securities were approved on a motion by Peterson and second by Andersen. On roll call vote, Motion carried. Supervisors voting in favor of said motion were: Don Andersen, Neil Blohm, Steve Hassler, Terry Nicholson, Roger Peterson, Deric Anderson, and Lisa Lunz. Absent: None. Supervisors voting against: None.

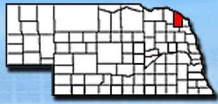

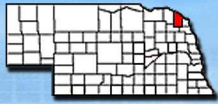
