The first regular meeting of the Dixon County Board of Supervisors for the year 2020 convened at 9:00 A.M. for reorganization in the Jury Room in the Dixon County Courthouse in Ponca, Nebraska on January 14, 2020. The meeting was opened with the Pledge of Allegiance. Notice was given to the public of the location of the posted Open Meetings Law. On roll call, members present were: Don Andersen, Neil Blohm, Alan Mackling, Terry Nicholson, Lisa Lunz, William Koch and Roger Peterson. Absent: None. Also present were Cindy Purucker, Dixon County Clerk and Secretary to the Board of Supervisors and other interested persons.

Motion was made by Koch, seconded by Nicholson to appoint Neil Blohm as Temporary Chairman. On roll call vote, Motion carried. Motion was made by Koch, seconded by Blohm to approve the Committees for 2020. On roll call vote, Motion carried. Supervisors voting in favor of said motion were: Don Anderson, Neil Blohm, Alan Mackling, Terry Nicholson, Roger Peterson, William Koch, and Lisa Lunz. Absent: None. Supervisors voting against: None.

The person whose name heads the list of each Committee is designated as the Chairman of that Committee (23-272).

The regular meeting of the Board shall be held on the second Tuesday of January. All other meetings are adjourned meetings.

Part-time Road Supt., Arnold Mellick and County Engineer Brian McDonald were present to discuss ongoing road and bridge projects. Brian McDonald updated the Board on the progress on the FEMA and EWP projects, the Martinsburg SE culvert and the bridges north of Emerson. He said that we should be getting an agreement from NDOR in the next week or so on the Emerson county line bridge. It will still be next year before it is completed. He is waiting on plans from NDOR for the box culverts at the Newton & Gardner Growers sites. The contractor has removed the bridge on the Emerson North project. He will have repair plans for bridge 4220 west of Allen at the next meeting.

The Board discussed Change Order #2 for the Martinsburg SE project. Mr. McDonald explained it was for the remainder of the rock needed to complete the project. The project was supposed to be a 45-day project and went over the projected days by 92 days. There will be a remainder left to pay to the contractor but we can deduct for silt fence and water not used. Also, we can decide whether to pay for the overage on days or impose a penalty.

Koch made a motion to not approve Change Order #2 on the Martinsburg SE project. The motion failed for lack of a second.

A motion to accept Change Order #2 on the Martinsburg SE project was made by Mackling and seconded by Nicholson. On roll call vote: Motion carried. Supervisors voting in favor of said motion were: Don Anderson, Neil Blohm, Alan Mackling, Terry Nicholson, Roger Peterson, and Lisa Lunz. Absent: None. Supervisors voting against: Koch.

Discussion was had on Pay Application #3 for Krusemark Construction & Excavation for the Martinsburg SE project. It was agreed to wait until the Board approved claims to decide on how they wanted to pay Krusemark Construction & Excavation.

A motion was made by Mackling to approve Pay Application #1 to Dixon Construction on the Emerson North project. It was seconded by Blohm. On roll call vote: Motion carried. Supervisors voting in favor of said motion were: Don Anderson, Neil Blohm, Alan Mackling, Terry Nicholson, Roger Peterson, William Koch, and Lisa Lunz. Absent: None. Supervisors voting against: None.





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Dixon County's 2020 One- and Six-Year Road Improvement Plan was discussed. Public Hearing on the Plan was set for February 11, 2020 at 9:15 A.M. on a motion by Koch and second by Blohm. On roll call vote, Motion carried. Supervisors voting in favor of said motion were: Don Anderson, Neil Blohm, Alan Mackling, Terry Nicholson, Roger Peterson, William Koch, and Lisa Lunz. Absent: None. Supervisors voting against: None.

Shea Scollard, Emergency Manager, stated there were two FEMA sites that have had no progress yet. Bridge 11730P and bridge 10310 need some repairs and rip rap. Brian McDonald said he would get the paperwork going.

Supervisor Blohm was not able to get quotes on dump boxes or a hydraulic lift for the International truck. Discussion was had on whether or not it is economical to put much money in such an old truck. Supervisor Blohm will look at a few options.

Motion by Koch, seconded by Blohm to appoint Shea Scollard as Emergency Manager and Lynn Johansen as Deputy Emergency Manager and 911 Director. On roll call vote, Motion carried. Supervisors voting in favor of said motion were: Don Anderson, Neil Blohm, Alan Mackling, Terry Nicholson, Roger Peterson, William Koch, and Lisa Lunz. Absent: None. Supervisors voting against: None. Resolution and Ordinance Book 2 Page 807.

Shea Scollard was appointed as primary rep. and Lynn Johansen as alternate rep. to the North East Regional Governance Board for the North East Planning, Exercise, Training & Interoperable Communications Region and a Memorandum of Understanding for the Northeast Region Planning Committee approved on a motion by Nicholson and seconded by Koch. On roll call vote, Motion carried. Supervisors voting in favor of said motion were: Don Anderson, Neil Blohm, Alan Mackling, Terry Nicholson, Roger Peterson, William Koch, and Lisa Lunz. The Emergency Management Performance Review for EMPG grant guidelines were tabled until next month. They will be completed by Chair Lunz after interviews are completed.

Motion was made by Mackling and seconded by Andersen to approve the Emergency Management Reimbursement Policy, Travel Policy, Purchasing Policy and Standard Operating Guidelines for Travel. On roll call vote: Motion carried. Supervisors voting in favor of said motion were: Don Anderson, Neil Blohm, Alan Mackling, Terry Nicholson, Roger Peterson, William Koch, and Lisa Lunz. Absent: None. Supervisors voting against: None.

Shea Scollard and Lynn Johansen were present to give Emergency Management Updates. Shea updated the Board on the FEMA flood progress. FEMA has reimbursed Dixon County for Emergency Preparedness and for barricades & flagging.

Lynn Johansen gave an update on progress with addressing.

Application from Bank First fka Iowa-Nebraska State Bank to be approved as a County Depository for 2020 were reviewed. Motion was made by Koch, seconded by Nicholson to adopt a resolution approving Bank First fka Iowa-Nebraska State Bank, Wakefield, NE as a County Depository for 2020. On roll call vote, Motion carried. Supervisors voting in favor of said motion were: Don Anderson, Neil Blohm, Alan Mackling, Terry Nicholson, Roger Peterson, William Koch, and Lisa Lunz. Absent: None. Supervisors voting against: None. Resolution & Ordinance Book 2 Page 811.

Discussion was had on making Dixon County's website an official means of publishing meeting notices. It was recommended by NACO that we do this. Koch made a motion to designate the county website as another official means of publishing meeting notices, seconded by Andersen. On roll call vote, Motion carried. Supervisors voting in favor of said motion were: Don Anderson, Neil Blohm, Alan Mackling, Terry Nicholson, Roger Peterson, William Koch, and Lisa Lunz. Absent: None. Supervisors voting against: None.





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After discussion a motion was made by Koch and seconded by Blohm to enter into an agreement for Software as a Service and a Managed Service Contract with Applied Connective Technologies for IT services. On roll call vote: Motion carried. Supervisors voting in favor of said motion were: Don Anderson, Neil Blohm, Alan Mackling, Terry Nicholson, Roger Peterson, William Koch, and Lisa Lunz. Absent: None. Supervisors voting against: None.

The Board recessed to meet as Board of Equalization and reconvened with all members present. The Board toured the jail.

Doug Ellis, Noxious Weed Superintendent, addressed the Board about disposing of surplus property. The Weed Board would like to sell the seed cleaner and an old boat on the Big Iron auction site. Doug will bring a list of surplus items to the February Board meeting for approval.

Jean Grove with the US Census, was present to inform the Board of the need for census workers. Dixon County only has 40% of the help they need. The job runs from March through June or July. She also stressed that all people need to be counted and the information that the census workers take in is confidential. Jean handed out flyers and brochures for the Board to hand out and post on the county's website.

The Board took a break for lunch at 12:00 P.M and reconvened at 1:00 P.M with all members present. County Attorney, Leland Miner was present to discuss legal concerns of the Board.

The County Clerk was notified by NACO that we need to have a resolution adopted following a public hearing to continue to elect the county surveyor. This needs to be completed by February 1, 2020.

Due to the February 1, 2020 deadline an emergency exists and a motion to amend the agenda to schedule a hearing for the consideration of whether or not to adopt a resolution to continue to elect a county surveyor was made by Koch and seconded by Andersen. On roll call vote: Motion carried. Supervisors voting in favor of said motion were: Don Anderson, Neil Blohm, Alan Mackling, Terry Nicholson, Roger Peterson, William Koch, and Lisa Lunz. Absent: None. Supervisors voting against: None.

A motion to hold a hearing on January 31, 2020 to receive public input on consideration of whether or not to adopt a resolution to continue to elect the county surveyor was made by Andersen and seconded by Koch. On roll call vote: Motion carried. Supervisors voting in favor of said motion were: Don Anderson, Neil Blohm, Alan Mackling, Terry Nicholson, Roger Peterson, William Koch, and Lisa Lunz. Absent: None. Supervisors voting against: None.

There were no safety committee recommendations. Amy Watchorn and JoAnn Brennan were present to discuss the safety glass for their respective offices. Supervisor Blohm, chairman of the Safety Committee, explained that they are looking into a USDA grant that would cover the FOB system, door replacements and safety glass as one project.

At 1:30 P.M. motion was made by Andersen, seconded by Blohm to go into closed session to discuss burial assistance application #20-01-1. On roll call vote, Motion carried. Supervisors voting in favor of said motion were: Don Anderson, Neil Blohm, Alan Mackling, Terry Nicholson, Roger Peterson, William Koch, and Lisa Lunz. Absent: None. Supervisors voting against: None.

Chairman Lunz re-stated the reason for the closed session was to discuss burial assistance application #20-01-1. Closed session was declared over at 1:42 P.M. on a motion by Koch and a second by Nicholson. On roll call vote: Motion carried. Supervisors voting in favor of said motion were: Don Anderson, Neil Blohm, Alan Mackling, Terry Nicholson, Roger Peterson, William Koch, and Lisa Lunz. Absent: None. Supervisors voting against: None.

Motion was made by Koch, seconded by Peterson to approve burial assistance app. #20-01-1. On roll call vote, Motion carried. Supervisors voting in favor of said motion were: Don Anderson, Neil Blohm, Alan Mackling, Terry Nicholson, Roger Peterson, William Koch, and Lisa Lunz. Absent: None. Supervisors voting against: None.





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Motion was made by Nicholson, seconded by Mackling to approve County Sheriff to dispose of non-functioning items on inventory. The listing is on file at the County Clerk's office. On roll call vote, Motion carried. Supervisors voting in favor of said motion were: Don Anderson, Neil Blohm, Alan Mackling, Terry Nicholson, Roger Peterson, William Koch, and Lisa Lunz. Absent: None. Supervisors voting against: None.

County Treasurer, JoAnn Brennan, informed the Board that NPAIT split from Union Bank, a Nebraska based bank and went out of state, which is against their trust by-laws. JoAnn stated that NFIT is associated with Union Bank and requested that the Board approve NFIT as a holding institution and allow her to invest funds with NFIT. A motion to allow the County Treasurer to invest funds with NFIT was made by Blohm with a second by Mackling. On roll call vote: Motion carried. Supervisors voting in favor of said motion were: Don Anderson, Neil Blohm, Alan Mackling, Terry Nicholson, Roger Peterson, William Koch, and Lisa Lunz. Absent: None. Supervisors voting against: None.

The County Treasurer was authorized to invest monies not needed for day to day operations in bonds, etc. on a motion by Andersen and seconded by Koch. On roll call vote, Motion carried. Supervisors voting in favor of said motion were: Don Anderson, Neil Blohm, Alan Mackling, Terry Nicholson, Roger Peterson, William Koch, and Lisa Lunz. Absent: None. Supervisors voting against: None.

The mileage reimbursement rate change to 57.5 cents per mile effective January 1, 2020 was approved on a motion by Nicholson, seconded by Mackling. On roll call vote, Motion carried. Supervisors voting in favor of said motion were: Don Anderson, Neil Blohm, Alan Mackling, Terry Nicholson, Roger Peterson, William Koch, and Lisa Lunz. Absent: None. Supervisors voting against: None.

The County Treasurer's Six-Month Report was reviewed.

The Noxious Weed deposited \$497.00 last month.

The Dixon County Historical Society presented a report of the expenses for the last six months.

The County Official's Fee Reports and Treasurer's List of Pledged Securities were approved on a motion by Koch and seconded by Andersen. On roll call vote, Motion carried. Supervisors voting in favor of said motion were: Don Anderson, Neil Blohm, Alan Mackling, Terry Nicholson, Roger Peterson, William Koch, and Lisa Lunz. Absent: None. Supervisors voting against: None.

Discussion was had on Pay Application #3 for Krusemark Construction & Excavation. The Board agreed to adjust the application on consideration of the 92 days over on completion of the project. The application was lowered from \$47,355.85 to \$40,355.85 with the last \$7,000.00 to be paid when the seeding is completed. The balance due of \$19,571.65 will not be paid due to the late completion of the project. A motion to change the pay application was made by Nicholson and seconded by Peterson. On roll call vote: Motion carried. Supervisors voting in favor of said motion were: Don Anderson, Neil Blohm, Alan Mackling, Terry Nicholson, Roger Peterson, William Koch, and Lisa Lunz. Absent: None. Supervisors voting against: Koch and Mackling.

The consensus was to have NDOT keep a look out for what we want instead of buying over the internet sight unseen.

Motion was made by Blohm, seconded by Andersen to approve the minutes of the last meeting as written. On roll call vote, Motion carried. Dixon County Engineer Brian McDonald and Arnold Mellick, Dixon County Highway Supt. were present to discuss ongoing road and bridge projects. Brian McDonald said that the excess funds on FEMA Site #11 was resolved. The Emerson North bridge (Forinash) project is still moving along. The contractor has two crews working on the bridge. Repairs on the Allen Northwest bridge was completed. The EWP projects from the March 2019 flood are getting tied up with cultural resources. Brian suggested that with the number of sites we have it could expedite the process if we would start working on surveys and setting the section corners. The Concord bridge that is also a FEMA project is surveyed but he has no plans yet.

Discussion was had on a letter the board received from Heidman Law Firm, Jacob Natwick, attorney representing Krusemark Construction and Excavation. Mike Krusemark is contesting the damages assessed to Krusemark for excessive days on the Martinsburg SE project. A letter from JEO, Brian McDonald, County Engineer, was distributed by Leland Miner, County Attorney. Mr. Natwick stated that since the change orders were approved that Mr. Krusemark was under the assumption timing on the project wasn't going to be a problem.

and Highway Superintendent Arnold Mellick were present to discuss ongoing road and bridge projects. Brian McDonald updated the Supervisors on the Emerson North county line project. Dixon County will need to enter into an Interlocal Agreement with Dakota County for replacing the bridge. The Scoping Agreement should be received by next month. Brian stated that they are looking at a January 2021 letting and the bridge should be started next spring. Federal Highway (FWHA) will be in charge of the damaged bridge on the county line north of Emerson, not FEMA because it's on a federal funded road. Brian is currently working on Right of Way for FEMA site #11. The Martinsburg SW Right of Way for the road has been staked. It should be bladed off soon. We should be able to make an offer for the property for Right of Way soon. There still needs to be an Archeological investigation done. Brian still has had no word from NRCS on our EWP (Emergency Watershed Program) grants. A project listed on the EWP program was discussed. Repairs need to be done right away or the structure could be compromised. Brian said that we can do maintenance to save the bridge without jeopardizing the project. Preliminary plans and quantities are almost done on the Dixon NW project. They should be ready for approval next month.

Fracture Critical bridge inspection regulations have changed. The State is handing them back over to the County to schedule. The County will now be responsible for finding a qualified inspector to do them. Fracture Critical inspections are more extensive than regular routine inspections. Brian will look into when the county's fracture critical inspections are to be done.

Crack sealing and striping on the Concord blacktop should be done every couple of years. Brian will send the requirements to the vendors for quotes.

Discussion was had on equipment and vehicle purchases. Questions were raised about when major purchases are to be made should they go to a committee or come right to the Board with the request? There should be a procedure for equipment purchasing. Chair Lunz will set up a County Road Equipment Committee that will present requests to the Board before major purchases are to be made.

Emergency Manager, Shea Scollard said he has been on conference calls and receiving a lot of emails regarding COVID-19. His goal is trying to keep the elected officials and public informed on any of the latest developments through weekly news releases. He is still working on 2018 & 2019 flooding and other emergency duties.

Lynn Johansen, 911 director told the Board that she had a meeting with Northeast Nebraska Public Health. She is setting up functions on the Ponca tower in order to be able to take over as a backup for Cedar County.

Chair Lunz set up a meeting earlier in April to go over budgeting plans for next year with Sheriff Taylor, Deputy Tom Decker, Emergency Manager Shea Scollard and Lynn Johansen, 911 Coordinator.

Handbook discussion was tabled until May. Chair Lunz would like to talk to the road employees once more before we approve the handbook.

Motion was made by Koch, seconded by Mackling to change the May meeting date to May 15th since the Primary Election is on May 12th. On roll call vote: Motion carried. Supervisors voting in favor of said motion were: Don Anderson, Neil Blohm, Alan Mackling, Terry Nicholson, Roger Peterson, William Koch, and Lisa Lunz. Absent: None. Dixon County Engineer, Brian McDonald and part time Highway Supt. Arnold Mellick were present to discuss ongoing road and bridge projects. Brian stated that the County Attorney is working on the Interlocal Agreement with Dakota County on the Emerson North county line bridge, the scope of the project has been submitted to FHWA. Information on the bridge SW of Concord has been sent to FEMA. He also talked to the project manager for the EWP projects and they are waiting on tribal approval. The Emerson North, Forinash bridge, should be completed today. The county road workers were seeding and graveling the approaches. He touched on other projects that are coming up. The project C26-(306) for the relocation of 583.5 Road south of Highway 20, the state has agreed to pay \$64,250.00 towards the construction of the new road. 
Outstanding loans on machinery was discussed. It was decided to pay off all the machinery loans with the monies left in the road budget.

The public is strongly encouraged to use alternative methods to do business with the Courthouse offices: Online, by phone, or using the drop box.

Chair Lunz gave notice to the public of the location of the posted Open Meetings Law.

Motion was made by Nicholson, seconded by Blohm to show that this meeting was preceded by due and legal notice by posting as required by law in the Bank of Dixon County, bulletin board in the lower hall of the courthouse, bulletin board in the County Clerk's office and two County newspapers, and all Board Members were notified simultaneously and the agenda of all know business to come before the Board of Supervisors was posted in the office of the County Clerk. On roll call vote, Motion carried. Supervisors voting in favor of said motion were: Don Anderson, Neil Blohm, Alan Mackling, Terry Nicholson, Roger Peterson, William Koch, and Lisa Lunz. Dixon County Road Supt., Arnold Mellick and Engineer, Brian McDonald were present to discuss ongoing road and bridge projects. Brian reviewed the road realignment on 583.5 Road south of Highway 20. The Right of Way contracts and deed have been completed. He received the Notice to Proceed on the Emerson North Federal Highway bridge project. The interlocal agreement with Dakota County is in place. **Resolution in Resolution & Ordinances Book 2, Page 847.** Brian is preparing right of way documents for FEMA Site #11 for Supervisor Mackling to execute.

The Bridge Match Program was discussed. Brian said that the Board needed to decide which project we want to apply for. It was decided to apply for the Newcastle SW project that is replacing the bridge with a box culvert. Brian will work with Bill to move forward with acquiring right of way.

Chair Lunz asked Brian if the NRCS is progressing on the EWP projects or if we would be further ahead in making a couple of the repairs before we get heavy rains and compromise some bridges further. Brian stated that that was the County's call on what projects need immediate attention. We could pick a couple of the worst and fix them before they become further compromised. In working with the townships on the map of the county it was brought to our attention that some of the roads are missing in the plat book. Chair Lunz asked Brian how we can add those roads to the State's map. He replied that we can modify a map and send it to him and he will send it in.

Chair Lunz called for a Special Meeting on July 28th at 9:00 A.M. at the Annex building to go over the county road map and to talk about the budget.

Shea Scollard, Emergency Manager, gave an update on the FEMA projects and COVID-19 reimbursements. There have been no complaints on the courthouse opening.

Lynn Johansen, 911 Director, stated that the south tower repairs will be done in two weeks. The north tower is going to be reprogrammed for the new state system. The mapping system servers are being installed today. In a couple of weeks, the software will be installed. The Civil Air Patrol wants to put an antenna on the Ponca tower. Lynn said that their frequency will not interfere with our radios. There will need to be an agreement signed before they can install anything on the tower. Lynn stated that we will need to compare our updated road map with the 911 map so they know which roads are minimum maintenance roads. Lynn also submitted her resignation as 911 Director and Deputy Emergency Manager effective July 31, 2020. The Board regretfully accepted her resignation and thanked her for her years of service.

Sheriff Taylor shared the grants that Sara Kumm has applied for and the amount the County has received. She has applied for grants for 14 projects, 2 of which we are waiting on. The County has received \$83,466.96 because of her hard work.

The Safety Committee met on July 13, 2020 and had the following recommendations for the Board, the roof over the generator room is getting fixed by Casey Roofing in 2 weeks. Sara is going to set up tornado drill training and a tornado drill. She also updated the Board on the fob system and door grant status. Panic button protocol was discussed and a plan will be handed out to all the offices. The Safety Committee also wanted the Board to consider the purchase of hip waders for the road department. There was a slip & fall injury due to trying not to fall into water while fixing a culvert.

The Board recessed to meet as Board of Equalization, and reconvened with all members present.

A letter was received from the Newcastle American Legion Post recommending Barney Rohan be appointed as the Newcastle area Veteran's Service Committee member. Koch made a motion to accept the recommendation, seconded by Peterson. On roll call vote: Motion carried. Don Andersen was approached regarding moving the athletic sign to the annex property next to the Ponca town sign from its current location at the entrance to Ponca. He told the person they would have to check with regulations from NDOT since it would be close to their right of way. The Board had some reservations regarding the placing of the sign on county property.

The meeting to determine final levy allocations for misc. subdivisions was set for August 27, 2020 at 9:00 A.M.

County Attorney, Leland Miner, Assessor, Amy Watchorn, County Clerk, Cindy Purucker and Treasurer, JoAnn Brennan, & Clerk of District Court, Jackie King-Coughlin met with the Board to discuss





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budget expectations with regard to salary increases for Courthouse employees. Leland Miner told the Board that the County officials met on June 29th to discuss cost of living increases for their employees. He explained that they didn't have an increase amount because we are waiting to see how the union negotiations they were going. The item will be tabled until the August meeting.

The County Assessor stated her means of arriving at the values were by following the rules and regulations set by the Property Assessment and Taxation Division. The Nebraska Assessor's Reference Manual, Nebraska Agricultural Land Valuation Manual, 2020 Reports and Opinions of the Property Tax Administrator and the Dixon County Sales Book were all available during the protest hearings. The County Assessor presented documentation of assessment practices and procedures, to be made a part of each session of the County Board of Equalization and a part of the record of each protest by reference for these proceedings of the Dixon County Board of Equalization.

At this time the Board commenced a taped recording of considerations of taxpayer's written and oral protests, in reference to the 2020 valuation protests, which had been filed on or before July 1, 2020. Hearings were held on protest numbers one through seven. The County Clerk will notify the protestors of the Board's decision.

Jeffrey W. & Juanita F. Dose were not present to discuss Protest #1. They requested the valuation be lowered because it is a fixer upper. No improvements have been done. After discussion, motion was made by Blohm, seconded by Mackling to follow the recommendation of the Assessor, which indicates no change at this time on Protest #1. The Assessor explained the condition of the home was considered in the valuation for 2020 as was the current market in the city of Wakefield. On roll call vote, Motion carried. On roll call vote, Motion carried. Supervisors voting in favor of said motion were: Don Anderson, Neil Blohm, Alan Mackling, Terry Nicholson, Roger Peterson, and Lisa Lunz. Supervisors voting against: None. Absent: Koch.

Motion was made by Blohm, seconded by Andersen to approve the minutes of the July 15th, July 16th & July 28th meetings with the correction of a couple typographical errors in the July 15th meeting. On roll call vote, Motion carried. Supervisors voting in favor of said motion were: Don Anderson, Neil Blohm, Alan Mackling, Terry Nicholson, Roger Peterson, and Lisa Lunz. Supervisors voting against: None. Absent: Koch.

Dixon County Road Supt., Arnold Mellick and Engineer, Brian McDonald were present to discuss ongoing road and bridge projects.

Brian McDonald, County Engineer, updated the Board on the Emerson North county line FHW project. They started to survey the bridge and he has a meeting with the Army Corps of Engineers next week. The Bridge Match program won't be released until October. Right-of-Way on FEMA Site #11 is ready to proceed. Brian will meet with Supervisor Mackling and Mr. Smith to complete the process.

Brian also stated that the bridge southwest of Concord will be let for spring 2021 construction. The use of the Bengsten bridge FEMA money was discussed and a couple of bridges were suggested and the possibility of replacing a couple bridges with box culverts.

The Board asked Brian to look at bridge #10205 on the Mulberry Bend road, to check the head cut on bridge #42120 south of Highway 12 between sections 34 & 35, bridge 2030P, on Silvercreek Road to see if it could be widened or if it needs replaced.

The Van Lent bridge head cut was discussed. Brian stated this is an EWP project and we should wait until the Emerson county line bridge is completed to move forward and wait for that funding to come through.

The road realignment south of Martinsburg needs sloping and fine grading done. Letting the road sit for a season will help settle the road and staking will be done next spring completion.

Arnold Mellick, Dixon County Highway Supt. received a request from NDOT to temporarily close the intersection of 868 Road and Highway 116 while the bridge is being repaired. The Board agreed to let the road be closed temporarily for bridge repairs.

Fracture Critical Bridge Inspections were discussed. Brian stated that we have 10 or 11 bridges that need inspected. The cost would be about \$1,000.00 to \$1,500.00 per bridge. The Board requested that JEO do the inspections. Inspections need to be completed by October.

There was project discussion on the 2021 1- & 6-Year Road Plan.

Shea Scollard, Emergency Manager, informed the Board that he had been working on his budget, inventory, the COVID-19 disaster and the 2018, & 2019 Floods. He has also been working on the Hazard Mitigation Plan and the EMPG Grant. He has taken over the towers since Lynn Johansen resigned. He is working on the FCC license and a contract with the Civil Air Patrol. He has been in talks with the Iowa Red





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Cross for future assistance if needed. Several 911 signs were found and are being placed. He is continuing to work with mapping and re-organizing since Lynn left. Shea and Sara are meeting with the Fire Chiefs on August 13th to discuss a rescue boundary map. Shea also stated that he and Sara were notified that the tower at Maskell has a washout on the approach that needs covered with a grate. The county will take care of it.

Sara Kumm, 911 Coordinator, stated in the transition she has deposited older checks from money that we get from 911-line charges. A list of bills is being checked out to see if they have been paid.

Geo Comm, the dispatching/mapping program, has been installed. Accounts have been set up for the dispatchers, Shea and Sara. They are waiting on a backup server to be put in place. Map building is being transferred from the old system and they are starting to build a map. They will start testing in mid -September and go live at the end of October.

Sara also stated that because of COVID-19 the state cancelled the statewide radio system grant. An estimate was received from Motorola to do the needed upgrades before the statewide radio system can be installed. Our contract will run for 5 years.

The repeater was replaced in the North Tower. Coax and an antenna were replaced on the South Tower. The climbing company will be coming back to remove the old coax and pull anything off that needs cleaned off. She stated that the repeaters on the South Tower need replaced in the near future. She has started to set up a budget plan to start a replacement rotation for the repeaters.

Sara gave a door and FOB system update. The contractor will be here this week with a door guy so he understands what we need and can submit a bid next week. Midwest Alarm will be discussing door locks with the contractor also.

The tornado drill is set for September 14th at noon. Training will be held September 10th & 11th at 9:00 A.M. in the courtroom. Evaluators will be chosen at the September meeting.

The Board recessed to meet as Board of Equalization, and reconvened with all members present except Koch.

County Attorney, Leland Miner was present to discuss legal concerns of the Board.

The agreement with Lancaster County Youth Services for juvenile detention services was discussed. Leland recommended that we sign the contract in the case we would ever need their services. A motion to sign the contract was made by Blohm and seconded by Mackling. On roll call vote Motion carried. The closed bridge south of Waterbury on the county line is under an emergency status. It is being handled by Dakota County. A shoefly will be installed until the bridge can be fixed or replaced.

The Bridge Match program will be published in October. Fracture critical bridge inspections will be done in October. Brian will be talking with NRCS regarding the EWP projects in order to get them moving. The Concord FEMA bridge will be on target in the spring. The Van Lent bridge needs rock to help control the head cutting. We will apply for the Bridge Match monies for Newcastle South box culvert. Brian checked out the Hoesing bridge. The channel has not dropped but has shifted toward the abutment. We will be using the FEMA money from not fixing the Bengston bridge to repair or replace the Nelson bridge.

The State will start work on Highway 20 next year. The new road will not be able to be opened until that project is completed.

The Board reviewed the 20211&6 Year Road Plan. Highway Supt. Mellick will coordinate with the County Clerk to get it done for a hearing next month.

Supervisor Koch stated that the Kenny Kneifl bridge needs repairs on the Newcastle-Martinsburg road. Supervisor Koch made a motion to hold the 1&6 Year Road Plan hearing on October 13, 2020 at 9:15 A.M., seconded by Blohm. On roll call vote: Motion carried. Emergency Manager, Shea Scollard was present to discuss ongoing projects. FCC licensing is done and updated. Kevin Garvin, Cedar County Emergency Manager helped a great deal. Civil Air Patrol contract is being looked at by the County Attorney for Board approval. The Hazard Mitigation Plan is being updated. Grants are opening up again. Shea has applied for a tornado siren for Newcastle. The annex parking lot gravel from the 2019 flood has been obligated for by FEMA. Addressing and mapping are going well, soon they will be done from Highway 20 south. There were some old addressing signs from the beginning of the 911 program that were found and they will be recycling them. The requirements for COVID-19 reimbursement for materials and payroll keeps changing.

Sara Kumm, 911 Coordinator, stated that tornado drill instruction will be held this Thursday & Friday. Next Monday, September 14th, at 12:00 Noon will be a drill. Three Board members will evaluate the drill. The Cedar County Backup Dispatch System is estimated at under \$10,000, much less than the initial estimate. In talking with Kevin Garvin, Cedar County Emergency Manager, they didn't need some of the options that was originally estimated. The Board told Sara to go ahead and get it done.

Brian stated that he had a meeting with the Corps of Engineers and NDOT on the Emerson North county line bridge. A drop structure was approved in the project. He will finalize the preliminary plan on the drop structure. NDOR is looking at a May letting date.

Brian talked to Alan at NRCS regarding the EWP projects. The projects have been submitted to Washington for final approval. He is hoping to know something next month. The time frame is tight from approval to completion. Brian wanted approval to get the surveys done ahead of time. The Board gave their approval. He requested that we appoint a ROW negotiator at the next board meeting.

Brian also discussed the Echtenkamp bridge, updating the environmental on the Newcastle box culvert, the Van Lent drop structure and the Nelson bridge/Bengston FEMA money. Shea Scollard, Emergency Manager, stated that FEMA only wants to reimburse the County for \$75,000.00 on the bridge to replace the dirt. Brian McDonald is resubmitting the damage estimate for reconsideration. The Concord bridge is a spring/summer construction. Shea also said that the FEMA reimbursements should be paid yet this year on the Wakefield NW, Emerson N (Forinash) and Martinsburg SE bridges. They are in the last stages of the FEMA process. We have not been reimbursed for the NEMA share yet.

The Mulberry Bend bridge is considered maintenance and can be repaired with a 6' berm on the east side and wrap rock around both wings.

HDR sent a supplemental agreement regarding additional NEPA services. Brian explained that it is for the additional cost of public meetings. Motion was made by Andersen to authorize the Board Chair to sign Supplemental Agreement #1 and Resolution for NEPA Services with HDR on Emerson North, seconded by Peterson. On roll call vote: Supervisors voting in favor of said motion were: Don Anderson, Neil Blohm, Alan Mackling, Roger Peterson, William Koch, and Lisa Lunz. Absent: Nicholson. Supervisors voting against: None. (Resolution & Ordinance Book 2, page 866)

Shea Scollard, gave Emergency Management updates. He has applied for COVID-19 reimbursement for supplies and law enforcement wages. The deadline has been extended until the end of December 2020. Dixon County is in the process of renewing their joint Hazard Mitigation Plan with Cedar County. He and Sara are working on 911 signs and the mapping. The EMPG audit is on Wednesday.

Sara Kumm, 911 Coordinator, is working on the 911 audit and the mapping system. She hopes to be able to go live on November 8th. She put in a claim for the FOB system in order to comply with the NIRMA grant. There have been some security camera issues. She would like to replace the backlot camera, treasurer's hallway camera and install a face recognition camera at the front door. She handed out information on Getac video systems for in-car video and bodycams.

At 10:50 A.M. a budget hearing was held to amend the budget in the General Fund from \$4,445,284.59 to \$3,857,053.60 and to change the proposed tax rate from 0.319521 to 0.277240. Following the hearing, motion was made by Blohm, seconded by Peterson to exceed the restricted funds by an additional 1%. On roll call vote, Supervisors voting in favor of said motion were: Don Anderson, Neil Blohm, Alan Mackling, Roger Peterson, William Koch, and Lisa Lunz. Absent: Nicholson. Supervisors voting against: None.

Motion was made by Mackling to adopt the resolution to amend the 2020-2021 budget, seconded by Koch. On roll call vote: Supervisors voting in favor of said motion were: Don Anderson, Neil Blohm, Alan

Dixon County Road Supt., Arnold Mellick and County Engineer Brian McDonald were present to discuss ongoing road and bridge projects. Brian updated the Board on the EWP projects. The plans need approved by NRCS and then we set a letting date. NRCS will be sending a contract soon.

Brian informed the Board that he is finishing up the paperwork on the Bridge Match application. It needs submitted by December 4th. We will be notified in January if the project is approved.

There was only 1 bridge on the fracture critical bridge inspection list that was to be done this year. It was completed and just needs a weight limit sign installed.

Plans were given to Dakota County on the county line bridge south of Waterbury. The Dakota County Commissioners rejected the contractor and chose to have the bridge go for bids. It will be a spring project.

Flood Site #11 culvert replacement was completed. Emerson North county line bridge is still on track. The Concord bridge is considered a rocking project. Brian is still negotiating on the damage to the Bengsten bridge. The Van Lent and the Mulberry Bend bridges are EWP projects. The north bridge of Schutte's does not need to be replaced but the south one needs replaced. Brian will size the bridge and assess if we can put in a culvert or not. He sent out the environmental guys to get a study done and he is applying for corps permits. He is in the same process with the Echtenkamp and Nelson bridges.

Road miles were discussed, there are a few miles in Hooker Township that need added to the road map. It was suggested that culverts need to be mapped and we could use the camera that was purchased with GPS capabilities. The culverts could be a GPS overlay on the road map.

Shea Scollard gave an update on FEMA payments. NEMA still owes the county about \$180,000.00 yet. We have applied to Northeast Nebr. Economic Development for assistance. If that gets approved it could mean \$180,000.00 in additional help with flooding repair costs.

Motion was made by Nicholson to sign the Notice to Proceed and construction agreement with Detlefsen Construction for the Allen East project, seconded by Peterson. On roll call vote: Motion carried. Addressing & Mapping are getting completed. EMPG audit has been completed. He stated that when we get equipment at the Annex, he could move the snow from the parking area instead of hiring it done. The Board agreed to let Tyler King continue to move snow until we have the equipment at the annex available. Shea presented a letter to join the Lower Elkhorn LEPC (Local Emergency Planning Committee). They are more active than the LEPC we are currently connected with. He also had talked with Casey Roofing about rubber pads that would protect the membrane that is currently on the roof. The cost would be \$1,285.00. The Board suggested using the pads to protect the roofing.

Steve Martin, AFAN, was on conference call to discuss what Livestock Friendly designation means. He stated that it is a way to promote growth in the County and raise awareness for livestock promotion. He also stressed that livestock facilities need to meet all NDEQ requirements. He has submitted the Newcastle SW project for the Bridge Match program. We should know by January 4th if it has been approved or not. There is a meeting with NDOT today on the Emerson North county line bridge. The hydraulic plan has been submitted and the Plan in Hand will be held shortly.

Brian is going to do a site visit on the EWP projects to see what trees need removed. The bridge east of Hoesings is listed as debris removal, if we use county forces to do the work, we will need to keep track of the equipment and man hours. This may or may not be considered a project. June 7, 2021 is the deadline for completing the project but we can apply for a 60-day extension. The Randy Nelson bridge is listed and is also a FEMA replacement item for the Bengsten bridge. It shouldn't be listed as both. We don't want to spend money to fix a small issue if we are going to replace the bridge. The Concord bridge is mostly rock.

JEO completed the one fracture critical bridge inspection.

Brian will be starting on the bridge north of Schutte's. He recommended bidding the project as resheeting the backwalls instead of replacement. The bridge south of Schutte's will need dirt work and can be replaced with a box culvert or steel culvert. The Echtenkamp bridge west of Wakefield will be a culvert or box culvert. It is close to the intersection so it may be more than one.

The Hazard Mitigation Plan is progressing, they found that they need to add more addresses so it could be February before it is completed. The results of the EMPG audit were good.

Sara Kumm, 911 Coordinator reported that the mapping is ongoing. The Eagle View flyover is scheduled between January and May. They want no snow on the ground and no leaves so it could happen anytime. The ECAST system was installed. This automated equipment sends the cell reports to the state. The





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ENRIN system is installed on the tower and in the courthouse. It will be up and running after the first of the year. The paging for Cedar County is ordered and will be installed in January. The NextGen911 system is regionalizing. South Sioux City will be the main base. An interlocal agreement is being approved by the County Attorney. The Public Service Commission says we will be able to use 911 wireless funding on expenses related to the NextGen911 system. The GeoComm mapping is now live, the dispatchers were able to do video training. The CallWorks 911 system was 26 versions behind, those were upgraded on December 1st. The in-car and body cameras are starting to arrive. Deputies will be training in January. Courthouse cameras will be installed in January. The Rivertime 911 signing project was completed, all lots now have 911 numbers. The deputies will be able to test the statewide radio system in January with test radios. We have until July 1st to decide if we want to migrate to the statewide radio system.

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
